


### ON BEING ILL

Virginia Woolf, Audre Lorde et al.

People everywhere have found themselves faced with a global pandemic, during which we have learned to cope with sickness and all that accompanies it: isolation, immunity, loss of control, and recovery. Yet while no longer taboo, illness remains an unpopular theme in literature. In her essay, On Being III Virginia Woolf asks whether illness should not receive more literary attention, taking its place alongside the recurring themes of "love, battle and jealousy".

In this collaborative volume, authors, translators and illustrators have come together to represent past, present and future thinking about illness. Noteworthy contributions to this edition are **Deryn Rees-Jones**' preface to Woolf's essay from 1926 and the introduction to **Audre Lorde**'s *The Cancer Journals* of 1980. Against these, the voices of contemporary authors resonate as they contemplate the interactions between sickness and literature.

### THE LAST ONE


Fatima Daas

A brilliant and provocative prize-winning first novel by French/Algerian writer from the Paris immigrant suburbs.

The daughter of Algerian immigrants, **Fatima Daas** is raised in a home where love and sexuality are considered taboo and signs of affection avoided. Living in the majority-Muslim Clichy-sous-Bois, she often spends more than three hours a day on public transport to and from the city, where she feels like a tourist observing Parisian manners. She goes from unstable student to maladjusted adult, doing four years of therapy – her longest relationship. As she gains distance from her family and comes into her own, she grapples with her attraction to women and how it fits with her religion, which she continues to practice. When Nina comes into her life, she doesn't know exactly what she needs but feels that something crucial has been missing.



# MY FATHER'S DIET Adrian Nathan West

In a broken-down Middle American town, the disintegration of a struggling family – its ambitions and emotions worn thin – is laid bare through the cold eyes of its only son. While studying at the local community college to finish his degree, he works what his divorced parents deem to be menial jobs and tries to stay out of their way, keeping his pitiless observations about their lives to himself. He says nothing about his semi-estranged father's doomed attempts to find meaning in strip-mall spirituality. He says nothing about his mother's willingness to subjugate herself to men he deems unworthy. He says nothing about his own pity, disgust, compassion, tenderness, and love - and when his father enters a bodybuilding competition, he swallows his scorn and agrees to help. Instantly relatable, impeccably realized, and grimly hilarious, My Father's Diet is the perfect, bitesized novel for a world always keen to mistake narcissism for introspection.

# Ariana Harwicz and translated by Carolina Orloff and Annie McDermott


The third and final installment of **Ariana Harwicz**'s "Involuntary Trilogy" finds us on familiar, disquieting ground.

Under the spell of a mother's madness, the French countryside transforms into a dreamscape of interconnected imagery: animals, desire, the functions of the body. Most troublingly: the comfort of a teenage son. Scorning the bourgeois mores and conventionality of their small town, she withdraws him from school and the two embark on ever more antisocial and dangerous behaviour.

Compared to Virgina Woolf and Sylvia Plath, **Ariana Har-wicz** is one of the most radical figures in contemporary Argentinian literature. Her prose is characterized by its violence, eroticism, irony and direct criticism to the clichés surrounding the notions of the family and conventional relationships.



In the wake of an environmental cataclysm that has wiped out the rest of humankind, the Matriarch, her brother, and the family descended from their incest, cling to existence on the edges of a ruined city. The Matriarch, ruling with fear and force, dreams of starting humanity over. Surrounded by the silent forest and the dead suburbs, her family feel closer to the ruined world than to their parents. Nevertheless, they scavenge supplies and attempt to cultivate the poisoned earth, brutalizing and caring for one another in equal measure. For entertainment, they watch old VHS tapes of a TV show called Get Aquinas in Here, in which a problem-solving medieval saint faces down a sequence of logical and ethical dilemmas.

Told in extraordinary, intricate prose that moves with a life of its own, at times striking with the power of physical force, **Missouri Williams**'s debut novel is a blazingly original document of depravity and salvation.



### THE LOST SPELL




Dalit feminist stories of a south Indian village that dissolve the borders of realism, allegory and political fable.


### **PUTIN'S POSTBOX**




# MARRAM: MEMORIES OF SEA AND SPIDER SILK


Commissario Soneri, a Parma police officer and gourmet, is investigating an unsolved case of a dead body found in the River Po. His colleagues at the time couldn't decide if it was a suicide or a murder, nor could they establish the victim's identity. To close the case, Soneri needs to look a little further. It's just a formality, a matter of going through the motions. Soneri, however, is not one for formalities.

Soneri, an intelligent and apparently grouchy man, uses unconventional policing methods. His partner, Angela Cornelio, is a lawyer and helps him with his enquiries.

The investigation leads them to river life, where he tries to break the wall of silence, typical of small communities harbouring poachers, petty criminals and profiteers - even a monster in the waters of the River Po. Soneri realises that the fog surrounding the Po makes things invisible and people unseen; it changes their identities; it deceives. And sometimes it kills.


### **AFTERMATH**

### Preti Taneja

Usman Khan was convicted of terrorism-related offences at age 20, and sent to high-security prison. He was released eight years later, and allowed to travel to London for one day, to attend an event marking the fifth anniversary of a prison education programme he participated in. On 29 November, 2019, he sat with others at Fishmongers' Hall, some of whom he knew. Then he went to the bathroom to retrieve the things he had hidden there: a fake bomb vest and two knives, which he taped to his wrists. That day, he killed two people: Saskia Jones and Jack Merritt.

**Preti Taneja** taught fiction writing in prison for three years. Merritt oversaw her program; Khan was one of her students. In this searching lament by the award-winning author, Taneja interrogates the language of terror, trauma and grief. *Aftermath* is a profound attempt to regain trust after violence and to recapture a politics of hope through a determined dream of abolition.

My mother and I have been writing her obituary. We have been working on it for several years now. Before we started, she had already begun the project with my older sister. She wants to get it right.

From across the Atlantic, a daughter captures and assembles the idiosyncrasies of a life laid out in details. Van Horn renders in the most vivid and economical style the extraordinary quirks of a nonagenarian who remains so fiercely free in spirit in spite of her age. From WW2 Europe to the 2020 lockdown in rural New Hampshire, We Still Have the Telephone tactically exhibits only fragments of the main protagonist's past. Van Horn telescopes her reader between historical events, curious family history and a remarkable everyday. A quietly moving, yet also deeply funny literary mosaic in which one's cultural heritage is on a par with plastic straws, this portrait of a singular everywoman registers the fuzziness of the line between eccentricity and madness.

### CANZONE DI GUERRA

Tea Radan, the narrator of the novel Canzone di Guerra. reflects on her own past and in doing so, composes a forgotten mosaic of historical events that she wants to first tear apart and then reassemble with all the missing fragments. In front of the reader's eyes, a collage of different genres takes place - from (pseudo) autobiography to documentary material and culinary recipes. With them, the author **Daša Drndić** skilfully explores different perspectives on the issues of emigration and the unresolved history of the Second World War, while emphasising the absurdity of the politics of differences between neighbouring nations. The narrator subtly weaves the torturous story of searching for her own identity with a relaxed, sometimes disguised ironic style, which takes the reader surprisingly easily into the world of persecution and the sense of alienation between herself and others.




### THREAD RIPPER

Thread Ripper is a double-stranded novel about weaving, programming, and pioneering women. A tapestry-weaver in her thirties embarks on her first big commission: a digitally woven tapestry for a public building. As she works, devoting all her waking hours to the commission, she draws engrossing connections between the stuff that life is made from – DNA, plant tissue, algorithms, text, and textile – and that which disrupts it – radiation, pests, entropy, and doubt. In the novel's second strand, we meet Ada Lovelace, the 1830s mathematician and pioneer of computer programming, and mythical figures such as Penelope, the faithful wife of Odysseus, who wove and unpicked a shroud to put off her 108 suitors.


### THE VISITORS


### Suzannah Evans






Deceit is the first major work by **Yuri Felsen**, referred to by his contemporaries as 'the Russian Proust', a significant writer who died in the gas chambers in Auschwitz, and whose legacy and archive was destroyed by the Nazis.

Written in the form of a diary, the novel recounts the unnamed narrator's complex and emotionally fraught relationship with his love interest and sometime muse. While the plot itself is relatively simple, the real revelation in Felsen's writing is its supreme originality of language and psychological introspection.

Quite unlike any other writer in the Russian canon, Felsen evokes in rich, poetic, idiosyncratic prose not only the Zeitgeist of interwar Europe and his émigré milieu, but also its psychology and the existential crisis of the age. What Nabokov achieves with images and the physical world, Felsen does with the emotional and metaphysical.

In this 'remarkable' debut, to be published in October 2022, **Arji Manuelpillai** questions what makes a person radical, how the British government polices this thinking, and how marginalised groups are at risk.

Unusually for a poetry collection, the book is informed by interviews conducted by the author with figures from a cross-section of society including the mothers of former ISIS members, former English Defence League and National Front members, academics and writers. 





An eighty-year-old woman slips into a deep depression at the death of her husband, then resurfaces to gain a new lease on life. Her determination to fly in the face of convention – including striking up a friendship with a hijra person – confuses her bohemian daughter, who is used to thinking of herself as the more 'modern' of the two.
